#### EXPLANATORY NOTES

#### GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. This publication contains statistics of persons held in custody in gazetted prison establishments in New South Wales at midnight on the 30th June 1982. Those prisoners sentenced to periodic detention were included in the census data only if they were under detention on the weekend prior to Wednesday 30th June 1982. Prisoners on the Work Release II programme (under which they live at home and work at prison) were also included.
- 2. This New South Wales Prison Census was conducted as part of the first National Australian Prison Census for 30th June 1982. The proposal for a National Prison Census first emerged at a Correctional Administrators meeting in Melbourne in September 1980 as an offshoot from a review of correctional statistics. Preliminary technical discussions were held in December 1980 and a formal proposal went to the Ministers Conference held in New Zealand in April/May 1981. The Ministers discussed the proposed census at some length and finally agreed to the conduct of the first Australian National Prison Census.
- 3. The National Prison Census was co-ordinated by the Australian Institute of Criminology which has published the National data under separate cover. Further editing was completed on the New South Wales Census data after it was supplied to the Australian Institute of Criminology. Consequently there may be small differences in some totals presented in this current publication when compared to the National Report entitled Australian Prisoners, 1982.
- 4. The census data collected comprised three basic types of information:
  - i. general information on the demographic and social characteristics of the prisoners;
  - ii. information on the legal status of the prisoners, including the nature of the offence(s) or charge(s) for which the person is in prison;
  - iii. for prisoners actually serving a sentence, details of the sentence(s) being served.

The design of the basic data collection form (see Appendix 1) reflects these three areas.

5. The Department implemented this Census in 1982 by engaging the respective Senior Clerk (or Deputy Superintendent) of each Prison in the extraction of the Census material from prisoner records. This required those responsible for the collection of this data to study the file of each Prisoner present in the Prison on the 30th June 1982, and then to record and code this information on the Census forms supplied for this purpose.

#### CONCEPT OF AN EPISODE OF IMPRISONMENT

- 6. The statistics relate to prisoners held in custody on 30 June 1982, in respect of their "current episode" of imprisonment. Basically, an episode is a continuous period in prison. In distinguishing between the current and any previous episode of imprisonment the following rules were applied:
  - a) An episode was regarded as terminated by:
    - (i) release of the person to freedom, including release on parole or licence where the person had not returned to prison in breach of parole or licence by the census date:
    - (ii) release to a court or the police where the person is subsequently freed without having been returned to prison;
    - (iii) release on bail, or a bond, or to immigration authorities;
    - (iv) transfer to an institution other than a prison (eg. a psychiatric hospital); and
    - (v) escape from prison, where the person had not been returned to prison by the census date.
  - b) An episode was not regarded as terminated by:
    - (i) a transfer between prison establishments;
    - (ii) release to a court or to police where the prisoner is returned to prison within a day or so for the same offence(s);
    - (iii) change in the prisoner's legal status eg. when a remand prisoner is sentenced, or when a sentenced prisoner appeals against his conviction or sentence;
    - (iv) escape from prison, when the prisoner had been returned to prison by the census date; or
    - (v) release on parole or licence where the prisoner had been returned to prison in breach of parole or licence by the census date.
- 7. This concept of an episode differs substantially from that used in prisoner statistics published by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) for previous years. The major difference is that, in ABS statistics, an episode was regarded as terminated by:

- a) a change in the prisoner's legal status, even though the prisoner continued to be held in prison (although this was modified in cases of unsuccessful appeal) or
- b) release on parole or licence, or escape, whether or not the prisoner subsequently returned to prison in breach of parole or licence or as a recaptured escapee.

Because of these differences, care should be taken in comparing the data on offence and sentence contained in this report with that in the ABS bulletins.

#### LEGAL STATUS

- 8. For the purposes of this report, prisoners have been classified to the following six legal status categories:
  - (i) Unconvicted (awaiting court hearing/trial/extradition)
  - (ii) Convicted but awaiting sentence
  - (iii) Awaiting deportation
  - (iv) Awaiting result of appeal against conviction or sentence
  - (v) Under sentence no appeal current
  - (vi) Detained at the Governor's Pleasure (after being found not guilty on the grounds of insanity)

In Tables 6 and 8, these categories have been combined into the two status categories used in previously published ABS prisoner statistics, viz:

Not under sentence - comprising categories (i) to (iv) above.

Under sentence - comprising categories (v) & (vi) above.

This has been done to provide some comparability with previous years' statistics. In other tables, the two-way classification used in the National Prison Census publication is used, viz:

Unsentenced - comprising categories (i) to (iii) above.

Sentenced - comprising categories (iv) to (vi) above.

The difference between this and the ABS classification used in Tables 6 and 8 lies in the treatment of prisoners who are awaiting the result of appeal against conviction or sentence. In Tables 6 and 8 these are classified as "not under sentence" while elsewhere they are classified as "sentenced".

#### **CLASSIFICATION OF OFFENCES**

- 9. For the National Prison Census, the offences for which prisoners were held at 30 June 1982 were classified according to the Draft Australian National Classification of Offences (DANCO). In the present report, however, offences have been classified according to the Second Revision of the New South Wales Classification of Offences and of Care and Protection Orders for Children. This Classification was developed by the NSW Office of ABS in collaboration with State authorities and has been used in NSW prisons and courts statistics since 1973. (See Appendix 2.)
- 10. As a general rule, a legal charge of attempting, conspiring, or inciting to commit a crime, or aiding in the commission of, or participating as an accessory before the fact, to a crime, is classified to the offence category to which the crime so attempted, etc. is assigned. All cases of accessory after the fact to a crime are assigned to the category "Accessory after the fact".
- 11. While the Classification has, of necessity, been abbreviated in the tables that follow, it is reproduced in full as Appendix 2 of this publication. Further description of the concepts and definitions used in the Classification may be obtained from this Department or the ABS. It should be noted that the "Other" categories in the tables may include data coded to offence categories specified separately in the Classification but not recorded separately in the tables (e.g. data coded to 'Larceny of motor vehicle' would be included in "Other offences against property n.e.c., in Table 6).

#### **DETERMINATION OF MOST SERIOUS OFFENCE**

- 12. Although a prisoner may be held in prison for a number of different offences, only the most serious offence in the current prison episode was recorded in these statistics. This was basically the offence for which the longest sentence was passed for a single count, ignoring undecided appeals. Where no sentence had been passed at 30 June 1982, or two different offences had equal sentences, the offence with the lowest (NSW) offence code number was chosen (see Appendix 2).
- 13. The full instructions for choosing the most serious offence are included on the Census Data Collection form used in New South Wales (see Appendix 1). Where the prisoner was serving the balance of a sentence after revocation of parole or licence, all offences and sentences in that part of the episode before release on parole or licence were considered in

choosing the most serious offence, as well as any later offences. This treatment differs from that applied in previous ABS statistics, where an offence of 'breach of conditions of release' was taken to apply to the balance of the sentence.

#### TYPE OF SENTENCE

14. This item relates to the aggregate sentence imposed (see below). The category "Indefinite" refers to all aggregate sentences where a maximum term is specified and a minimum term or non-parole period is also set.

#### LEVEL OF COURT

15. This item represents the level of court of sentence, or of most recent remand in custody, for the most serious offence (see above). Appeal courts were recorded only where such courts have altered the length of sentence appropriate to the most serious offence.

#### AGGREGATE SENTENCE IMPOSED

16. This item represents the longest period that a person may be detained under sentence in the current episode. Charges pending that are likely to extend the current episode are ignored. Cumulative sentences are taken as equal to their united length. Concurrent sentences are taken as equal to one of them, or to the longer if they are of unequal length. Where sentences 'overlap', i.e. parts of the sentences are concurrent, the concurrent periods are counted only once. In the case of prisoners serving the balance of a sentence after revocation of parole or licence, the whole of the original sentence imposed was included rather than just the balance of the sentence, as in the ABS statistics.

#### SENTENCE SERVED

- 17. 'Sentence served' relates to prisoners who have had a sentence passed, and has been calculated as the period elapsed between the date the (aggregate) sentence commenced and 30 June 1982. Note that, for prisoners with parole or licence revoked or recaptured escapees, the 'sentence served' as calculated for these statistics would include the time spent outside prison between release or escape and return, and could thus overstate the actual time served towards the sentence.
- 18. Prisoners serving the balance of a sentence after revocation of parole or licence were separately identified in the Census, and are shown separately in Table 17, classified by most serious offence and sentence served. This Table therefore gives some indication of the effect of the new treatment of these prisoners on the overall statistics.

#### TIME HELD

19. 'Time held' relates to unsentenced prisoners, and has been calculated as the period elapsed between the date of first receival into prison in respect of the current episode, and 30 June 1982. Note that some of this time may have been spent as a sentenced prisoner (eg. for fine default).







#### MOST SERIOUS OFFENCE - INSTRUCTIONS (Question 14)

- These instructions explain how to choose the most serious offence where there is more than one offence. The offence codes are in the coding manual.
- NOTE: Even if the choice of the Most Serious Offence is relatively straight forward, it is still necessary to both WRITE the offence in the space provided and CODE the one Most Serious Offence in the boxes provided.
- FIRST decide whether a sentence has been passed for any offence. If a a sentence has been passed ignore any <u>undecided</u> appeal.

  Consider <u>all</u> offences in the episode since first receival, including offences for which sentence has expired.
- WHERE  $\underline{no}$  sentence has been passed, choose the offence with the lowest code number.
- WHERE sentence has been passed choose the offence with the longest sentence for a single count.
- WHERE equal sentences have been passed for more than one type of offence, code the offence with the lowest code number.
- WHERE the prisoner was in breach of parole or licence, consider all offences and sentences since receival before release on parole.
- WHERE a prisoner on remand or awaiting trial is serving time in default of fine(s), and has no other sentence, choose the offence with the greatest monetary value. If the value is equal for different offences, choose the offence with the lowest code.
- WHERE the same sentence has been given for more than one offence, write in each offence and sentence in the spaces provided.
- IF unsure which offence to code, write in each possible choice and its sentence (if any) in the spaces provided.
- A life sentence is treated as longer than detention at the Governor's Pleasure, and both life and G.P. as longer than any other sentence.

The act of attempting, conspiring, or inciting others to commit a crime, aiding in the commission of a crime, or participating as an accessory before the fact to a crime, should be classified to the offence group to which the crime itself belongs. Separate groups have been provided, however, for Attempted Murder and Conspiracy to Murder. Accessory after the fact is included in Group 500 under Offences Against Enforcement of Order.

NOTE: Where a prisoner has had parole or licence revoked, or been recaptured after escape, the one episode could include two (or more) periods actually in prison.

A detailed example of this is provided in the Census Manual.
