Instrument of Delegation

Admission as a lawyer subject to s.20 conditions

The Legal Profession Admission Board of NSW (the Board), pursuant to section 20A of the Legal Profession Uniform Law Application Act 2014 and Rule 30 of the Legal Profession Uniform Admission Rules 2015 (UAR), hereby delegates the following powers to the Legal Qualifications Committee (Committee) in the following circumstances:

- 1. This delegation applies in circumstances where a foreign lawyer has sought a conditional admission in the sense provided for in section 20 of the Legal Profession Uniform Law (Uniform Law), but does not apply where the applicant has made a significant disclosure pursuant to rule 17 of the UAR in the sense identified in the Board's "Guide for Applicants for Admission as a Lawyer in NSW".
- 2. The Committee is delegated the powers:
 - a. pursuant to section 19 of the Uniform Law, to issue or refuse a compliance certificate to a foreign lawyer; and
 - b. pursuant to section 20(1) of the Uniform Law, to include in that compliance certificate a recommendation to the Supreme Court that the foreign lawyer be admitted subject to conditions of the kind permitted by the provision.
- 3. Where the Committee has any doubts about the appropriate exercise of the power under section 20 it may refer the relevant application for admission to the Board.

The Authority given in this Instrument of Delegation continues until notice of cancellation is received from the Board at that time.
